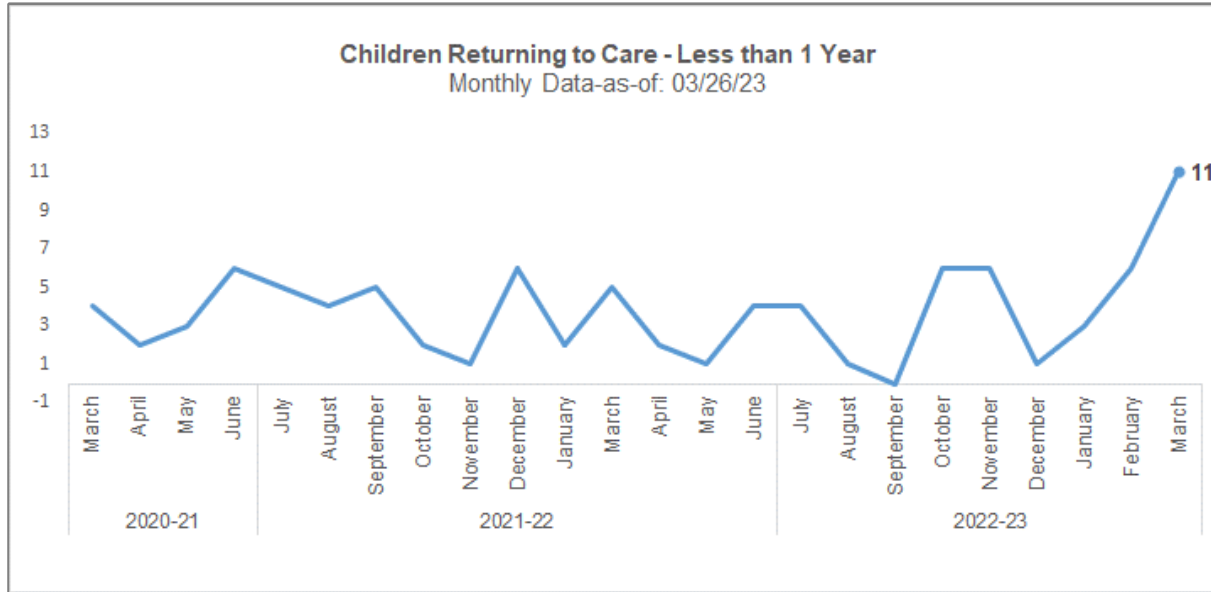

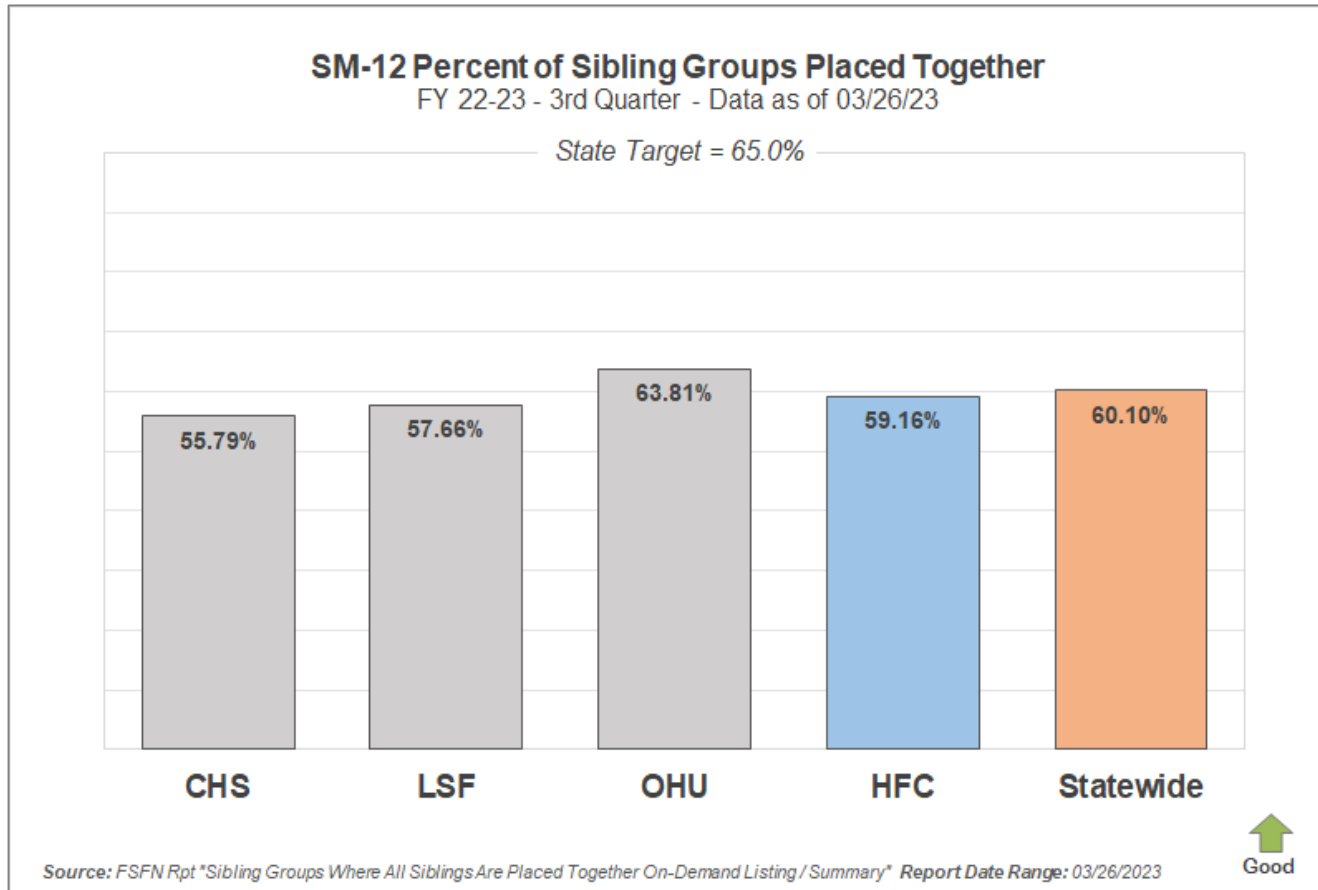

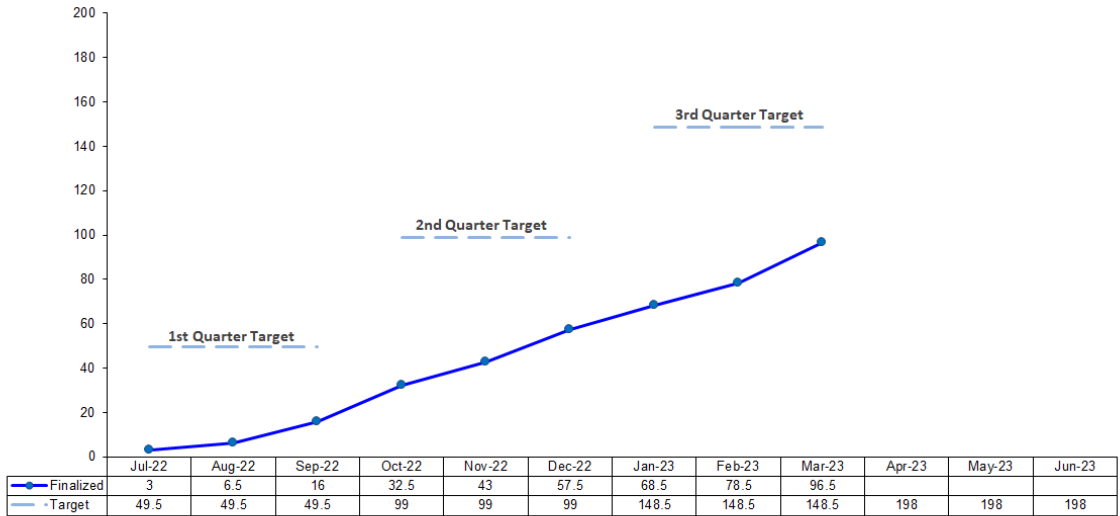
Number of sibling groups to achieve SM12 target – **19 Sibling Groups**

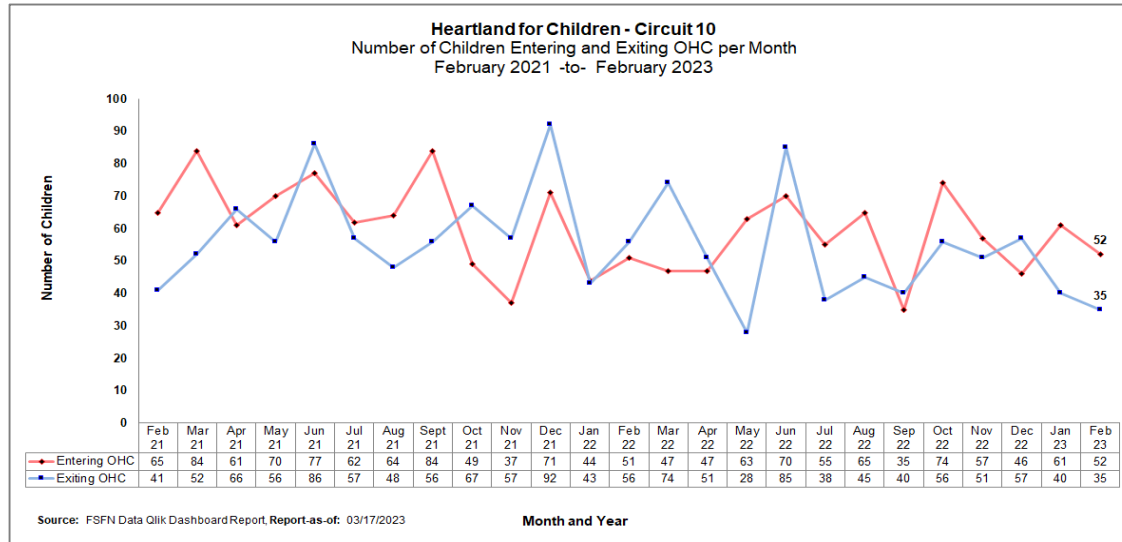

Number of Children Entering and Exiting Out-of-Home Care per Month





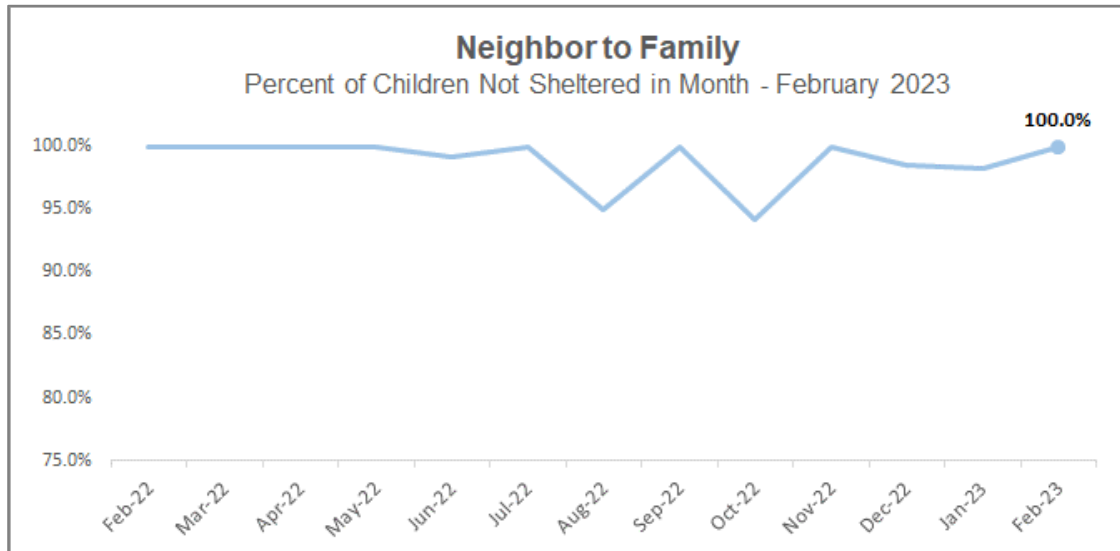

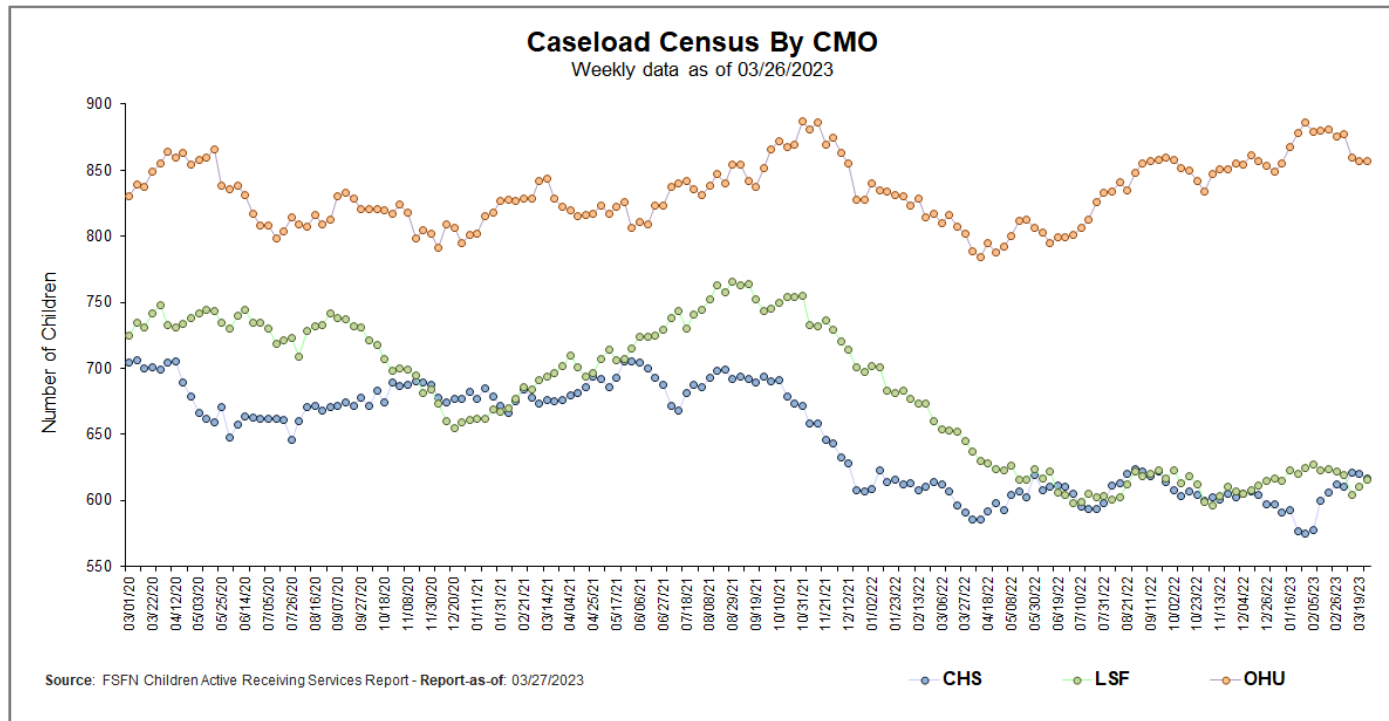

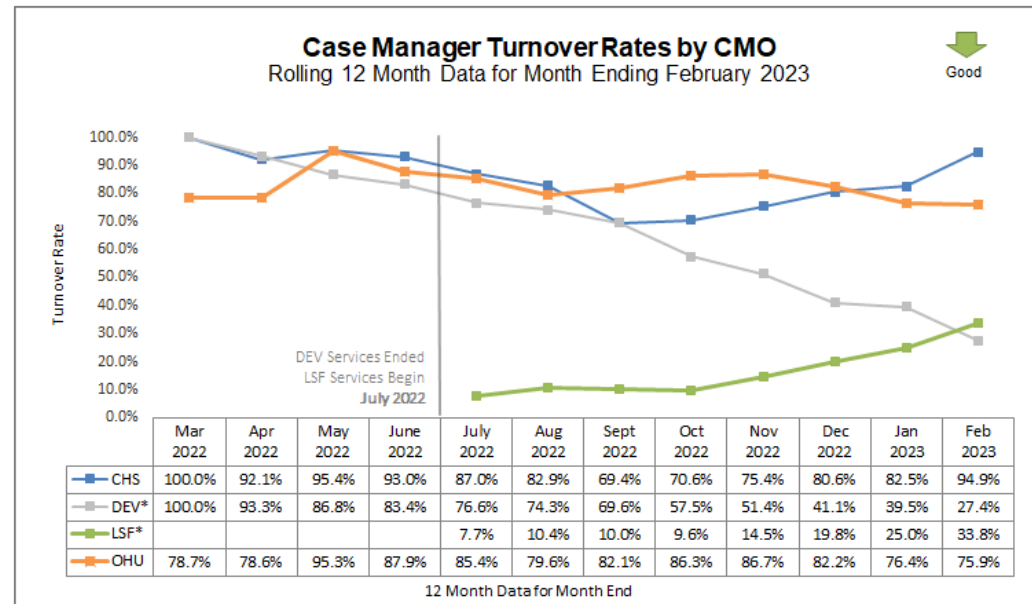

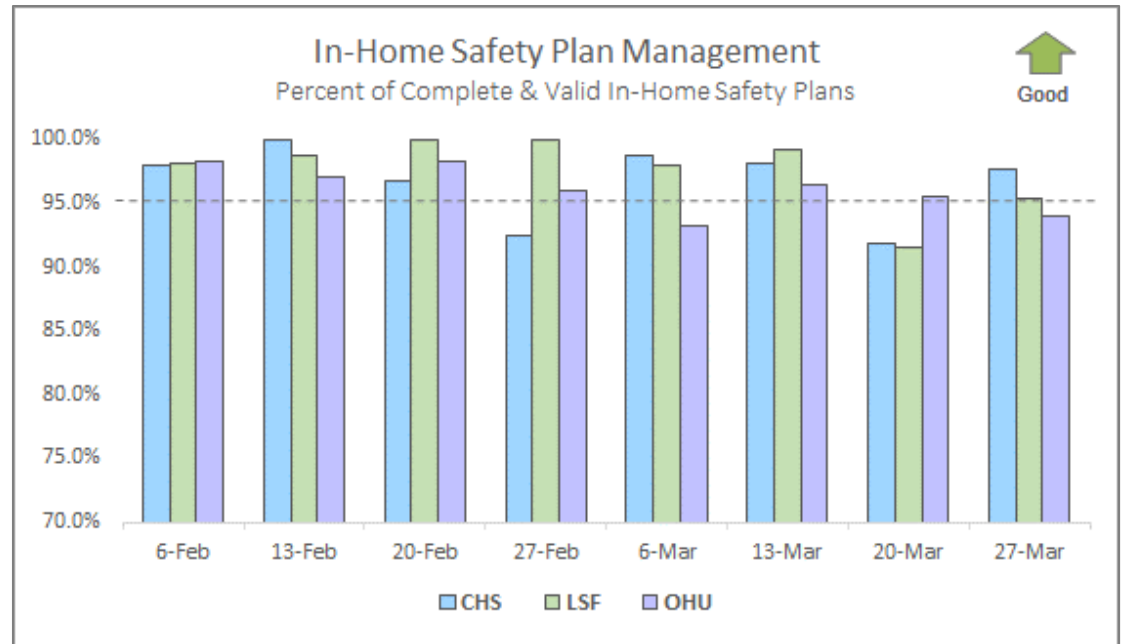

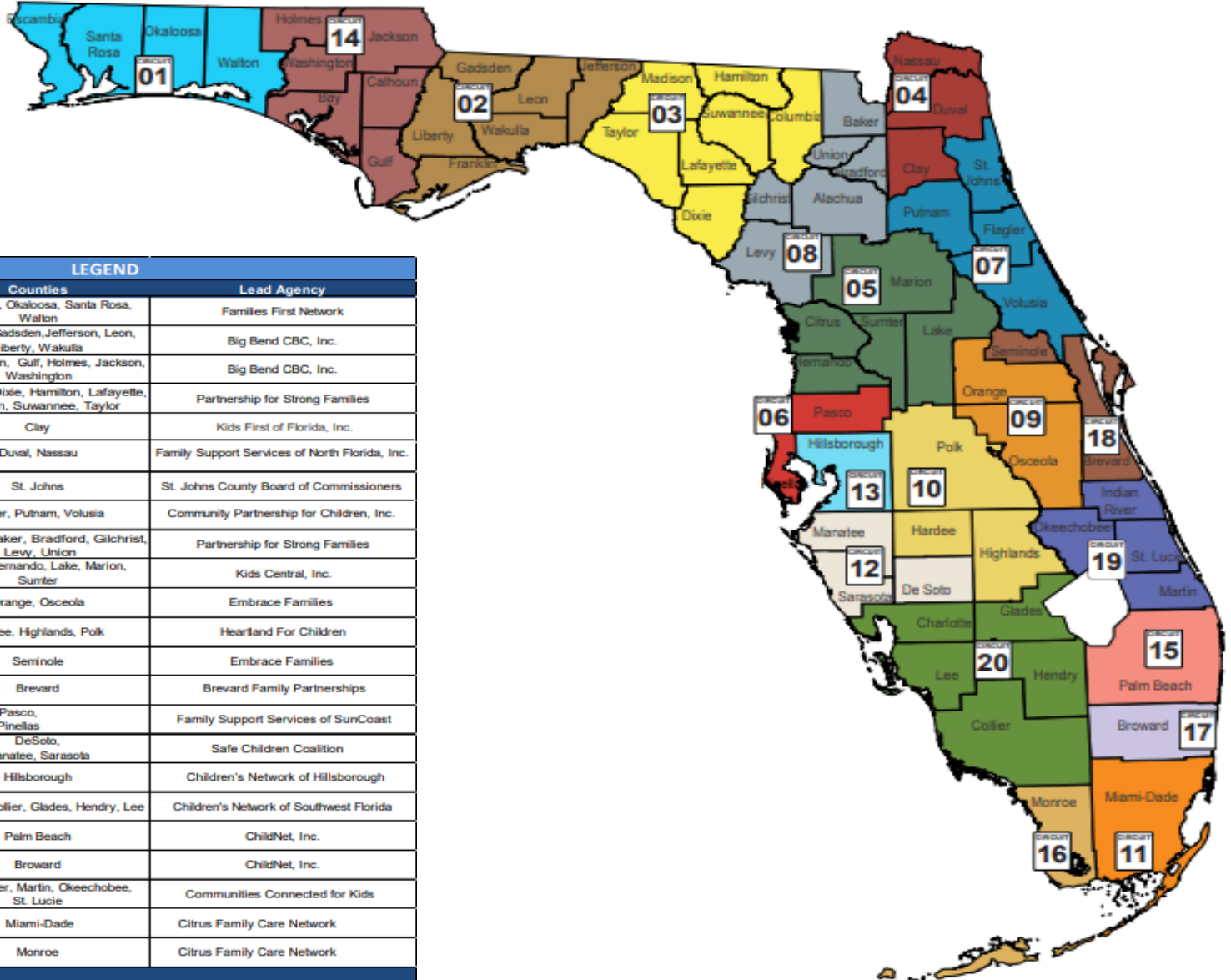
